A shiny gold dome crowns the Ochs Building, erected in 1892 to house the *Chattanooga Times* newspaper. Though officially named after founder Adolph Ochs, it is now called the Dome Building. Built in 1908, the Chattanooga Municipal Building features graceful arches and turrets. Joggers and amblers alike love the view from the historic Walnut Street Bridge, which spans the winding Tennessee River.
