



Outdoor Art Framed Succulents

SUPPLIES:

vintage frame, chicken wire, sheet moss, potting soil, assorted succulents, staple gun, ruler, wire cutters, pencil

STEP-BY-STEP INSTRUCTIONS

Step 1. Lay the empty frame face down on your work surface. Measure and cut a piece of chicken wire slightly larger than the opening of your frame. Attach the chicken wire to the back of the frame across the opening, using a staple gun. Pull the chicken wire taut as you attach it. Trim any excess wire.

Step 2. Place a layer of sheet moss face down across the chicken wire. Cover the moss with a 2-inch layer of potting soil. Place another layer of sheet moss face up across the soil. Using the method outlined in step one, attach another layer of chicken wire to the back of the frame, sandwiching the moss and the soil between the two layers of wire.

Step 3. Turn the frame assembly over so that it is face up on your work surface. Decide how you want to arrange your succulents, and use a pencil to poke a hole through the moss where each plant will go. Carefully feed the roots of each plant through its corresponding hole. Place your completed artwork on a porch or under an overhang where it will be protected from the elements.
